Wire Transfers are now ISO20022 formatted

Here's some information to get you started on what is ISO20022 and what you need to know going forward.

What is ISO20022?

The Federal Reserve Banks switched from a proprietary wire format that was specific to the Fedwire Funds Service (FAIM) to a new ISO20022 (ISO) format on July 14, 2025. ISO is a global standard used by many financial institutions and systems.

Here are some key terminology changes:
